#### WHO WE HELP:

Working families (single parent, two-parent, intergenerational, LGBTQ+) who are experiencing homelessness. Families most often come to us from extended-stay motels, doubled up with friends and family, or living in cars.

#### **OUR INTERVENTIONS:**

- Temporary shelter (families always stay together!)
- Wrap-around support from a CFH social worker and our shelter & housing support teams
- Life skills training and mental health care
- Subsidized housing with trusted landlord partners
- Professional development opportunities

#### **OUTCOME GOALS:**

After two years, families graduate our program with increased economic stability into unsubsidized affordable rentals or home ownership.

STABLE HOUSING BUILDS thriving families

Because of you, we were able to reopen Hawthorne Place, providing shelter and stability for 15 additional families. Thanks to your generosity, we hosted 48 workshops, offering families the tools and knowledge they need to thrive. From staffing our Jubilee store to volunteering at our Family Empowerment Summit, you've been there every step of the way, making an incredible difference in the lives of those we serve.

## IT'S ALWAYS BEEN ABOUT more than housing

Every day, when she shows up at work, Tabetha has to prove her value as a skilled professional while facing the demands of a high intensity career. It's estimated that less than 10% of crane operators working today are women. Being a woman in such a maledominated industry requires confidence, determination, focus, self-belief, hard work, and attention to detail.

Tabetha honed these remarkable skills at home doing the highest intensity job of all: being a single mom to her seven children.

Like all devoted moms, it's her kids who inspire her most to work hard and keep going in every situation. "I just want to give them the best that I possibly can," she says. "I know if I don't get up or if I don't make a way, then they don't have nobody else."

That spirit of love and resilience inspired her to take in her sister's three young children as her own a few years ago when they could no longer be in her sister's care. And it's that spirit that carries her through every daunting challenge she faces.

In 2023, Tabetha and her family were forced to abruptly leave their home. Without a financial safety net or a reliable support network to lean on, they had no place to land. She felt overwhelmed and guilty having to split up her children as she hurried to find a solution.



"At first, I'm not gonna lie, I was so embarrassed and humiliated," she recalls. "It was a very embarrassing and shameful moment for me to go through."

By chance, she overheard a social worker talking about Charlotte Family Housing. Learning that the program allowed her to keep her family together and provided more support than a typical shelter, she quickly applied.

She moved her family of eight into Plaza Place shelter where the tight quarters fostered a newfound closeness.

"I never thought that I could work and be able to manage all of us in one room like that," she recalls. "I found out that I'm stronger than I thought."

With the immediate threat of homelessness behind her, Tabetha found space to breathe and reflect. She embraced therapy and the emotional support offered by the compassionate CFH shelter staff, embarking on a journey of self-discovery and healing.

"I found out that I am more worthy than I thought I was. That I'm strong and that I can. And I learned to love myself a lot more too."


I've learned to love myself a lot more and been able to put some time into me. Charlotte Family Housing let me see that I'm constantly putting in to other people but I wasn't taking the time to care about me.

Now, a year into the program, her family is back in their own space with lots of room to live and play together.

In between her shifts at work, she's attending all the CFH workshops that she can, budgeting to consistently save money and taking classes through DreamKey Partners to prepare for homeownership. Her kids are doing soccer, football, and cheerleading, and making friends in their new neighborhood.

When she looks to the future, Tabetha feels confident that she'll finish the CFH program with the skills she needs for a life of financial independence and ongoing stability for her whole family. She aspires to build a legacy of determination and resilience for her children and to show them what it looks like to believe in themselves.

"Success in the program all depends on people's determination," she says. "For me, I'm determined to get to my finish line."

## FOCUSING ON CAREER DEVELOPMENT

As the economic demands of our city increase, we're giving our families more tools to succeed financially. This year, we began a partnership with Change Please Coffee. Moms in our program participated in their barista & hospitality workforce development program, opening doors to more sustainable and profitable career paths.

#### MAKING ROOM FOR MORE & MORE FAMILIES

Our secondary shelter site, Hawthorne Place, reopened this year after closing its doors during the pandemic. Volunteers rallied to clean and decorate, creating a welcoming space for up to 15 additional families.

#### CREATING A SAFE & HEALING SHELTER SPACE

Thanks to an amazing partnership with A Lotta Love Charlotte, our main shelter underwent a major renovation. The shared living room is where families gather for workshops, house meetings, and to rest and relax together after a long day of work. Our focus on trauma-informed care touches every part of the CFH program, including the interior design of our shelters.


#### EMPOWERING TWO GENERATIONS




